## McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act of 2001

#### Definition of Homelessness:

Children and youth who lack a regular, adequate and fixed nighttime residence including: those who share housing with other persons due to loss of housing or economic hardship; living in emergency or transitional shelters, motels, hotels, campgrounds, trailer parks, cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned building, or similar settings.



Local Liaison for Homeless Education: Dr. Sue Anne Marks Millis Public Schools Director of Student Services 508-376-7021 Families or unaccompanied youth living in any of the situations listed below, your preschool-aged and school aged children have certain rights or protections under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act:

In a shelter, hotel, motel, campground, trailer park
In cars, parks, public spaces or similar settings
In an abandoned building, trailer, or other inadequate accommodation
Doubled up with friends or relative because you can not afford housing

When you move into a situation listed above, you should do the following:

Contact Dr. Sue Anne Marks, the school district's Local Liaison for Homeless Education for help in enrolling your child in the new school OR arranging for your child to continue with his/her former placement

#### Rights of Homeless Students and Their Families (in part):

To go to school, no matter where they live or how long they have lived there.

They must be given access to the same public education, including pre-school education, provided to other children.

To stay in their original or last school even if they move to another district.

Homeless students have the right to stay in the school they attended prior to the loss of housing. This is called the "school of origin".

To get transportation to their original school.

School districts must arrange transportation for students in homeless situations so that student can stay at their school of origin.

To enroll immediately in a new school.

Homeless students who wish to enroll in a new school where they are situated while homeless, may attend classes immediately, without proof of residency, etc.

To automatically receive free breakfast and lunch at school.

The school must immediately begin providing meals based on verification.

To receive Title 1 services

To receive all education and supplemental services that all other children are provided.
